It's amazing when you can see months of work come together, and since our last update, three of our projects have come to a close.

On 14 September, we were delighted to host the Classic Vehicle Show in the town. Over 200 vehicles lined the streets of Biddulph, with visitors to the town treated to both nice weather and tasty treats from our local businesses. Our thanks to all the volunteers, judges and exhibitors. Same time next year!









On the same day, we were joined by the Deputy Lieutenant for Staffordshire Judy Scott Moncrieff to open the mosaic bench on Station Road. Biddulph Town Council commissioned Philip Hardaker to design and install a piece of public art. Philip lives locally and is well known for his community work, and for the creation of many important pieces of art around the country.

It was agreed that a bench would celebrate industries that have been prominent in Biddulph, such as nursing, fustian mills and transport. We wanted the bench to remember activities that happen(ed) in the town, such as 'pigeon fancying', bowling, football, tennis, etc. There are also images of some of our iconic buildings and heritage features. These are represented in tiles, which form a seat.

Children and members of a wide range of community groups were tasked with creating tiles that represent Biddulph now, and what it means to them.

The aim of the bench is to celebrate our past, but also the things we love about the town now. There are images of nature, flowers and animals.

We hope you enjoy sitting on the bench and also reflecting on the tiles that have been created by our community.

The following week saw the installation of three mining lamps on the St John's Road roundabout. Mining lamp sculptures were first installed in 2004. They were removed from the site in 2022 due to the need for repair and health and safety concerns. Biddulph Town Council made a commitment to bring back this public art to the roundabout. It is incredibly important to our community that we recognise and celebrate the heritage of our town.



The original lanterns could not be repaired. We worked with a fabrication company in Burslem to create something that people would identify as a mining lamp, whilst recognising the original intention of the lamps. The lamps are powered by solar power and should have a blue glow after dark. Plaques will be installed on the lanterns in the coming weeks.

Thanks to a wide range of partners for their involvement and commitment to this project.
