Brief Description	<p>Owned by Biddulph Town Council and maintained by Biddulph in Bloom at the entrance to Biddulph, from Stoke-on-Trent.</p> <p>In 2019, Biddulph in Bloom won Gold in the RHS Britain in Bloom competition and was the winner of the Large Town category.</p> <p>This competition is a powerful tool for building communities and tackling local issues. The judging process is rigorous, against a comprehensive set of criteria.</p> <p>Biddulph in Bloom areas were judged as having conservation and biodiversity benefits, being supportive of local heritage and demonstrating significant community participation, all of which are transferable to the Local Green Space criteria.</p>
