Brief Description	The grass verge is on Congleton Road, just in front of Biddulph Bowling Green and extends along to the junction with Woodhouse Lane. Greenway Moor WI representatives (in partnership with Biddulph in Bloom) perform this voluntary work regardless of whether the town is putting an entry into the competition or not. Therefore, it is an endeavour done by the people of the town, for the people of the town. This is a particularly good example (by the WI) and provides a beautiful passageway into the town from the north.
	In 2019, Biddulph in Bloom won Gold in the RHS Britain in Bloom competition and was the winner of the Large Town category.
	This competition is a powerful tool for building communities and tackling local issues. The judging process is rigorous, against a comprehensive set of criteria.
	Biddulph in Bloom areas were judged as having conservation and biodiversity benefits, being supportive of local heritage and demonstrating significant community participation, all of which are transferable to the Local Green Space criteria.

It is hugely valued by the people of the town and its visitors. This work is carried out throughout the year and this grass verge in particular is very well maintained. On entering the town this planted verge reinforces Biddulph's reputation as the "Garden Town of Staffordshire". Throughout the spring, summer and autumn months pollinators are supported by this planting and we should ensure it is not lost to them or to the people of Biddulph.
Size, Scale Local in character and is not an extensive tract of land.	V	This is not an extensive tract of land being only approximately 100 yds long. It has importance to the locality in that it reminds Biddulph and its visitors that the town is home to the best example of the Victorian Garden in the country (according to Alan Titchmarsh!)
