The end of virtual meetings?

Government was unable to extend the emergency legislation which enabled town and parish councils to meet virtually. This means that we must return to face-to-face meetings in order to make decisions. We're very disappointed by this, as we had more people than ever before getting involved in Town Council business. There was a High Court challenge to extend the legislation, but the court concluded that:

".... the Secretary of State was correct in November 2016 and July 2019 to say that primary legislation would be required to allow local authority "meetings" under the 1972 Act to take place remotely. In our view, once the Flexibility Regulations cease to apply, such meetings must take place at a single, specified geographical location; attending a meeting at such a location means physically going to it; and being "present" at such a meeting involves physical presence at that location."

We are now looking at ways to hold meetings where all the attendees are physically in the same space. We are mindful that some Councillors and the public are still shielding and we're also aware that social distancing requirements remain in place

for now. Our hope is that in June we can meet face-to-face again. We feel very strongly that a virtual element should be included in all future meetings. As a result, we are investigating ways for the Town Council to continue with a hybrid system of meetings to ensure that we can continue to involve people in local democracy.
