There are bus services that can help you get to the sessions—7a, 9, 93, 94 and 95. Timetables for all the services that travel around Biddulph are available from the Town Hall.

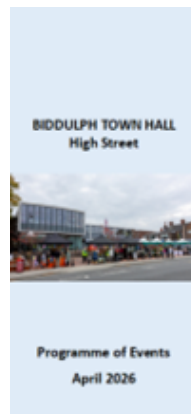
