Jodie Hancock explained that the document is updated annually following the precept and budget setting process. She advised that a 10% uplift has been applied to each budget line, reflecting the uncertainty in future years and the need for a cautious approach.

She outlined the rationale for this approach, noting that:

- A key driver is anticipated inflation across major cost categories—staff salaries, supplier contracts, utilities, and general overheads. Even if actual inflation varies year to year, applying a consistent 10% provides a prudent buffer against rising costs.
- The uplift acts as a built-in contingency.
- Biddulph Town Council anticipates growth (higher activity levels, expansion, increased demand), costs will typically rise alongside this. A 10% uplift can reflect scaling requirements—more staff, higher operational throughput, and increased support costs.

Proposed by Councillor Jones; seconded by Councillor Salt . All **agreed**.

129. TO RECEIVE AN VERBAL UPDATE ON TAX ADVICE DISCUSSIONS

Jodie Hancock reported that two sets of information have been sent to the advisor: income/ expenditure for 2025-26 (to highlight exempt income streams) and information about the Town Hall frontage development, to demonstrate that this was for heritage preservation/ community realm improvement, and not the improvement of Town Hall facilities.

This has all been sent off, there has not been a response as yet.

Following previous discussions, the Chief Officer had emailed the District Council Cabinet members in relation to Disabled Facilities Grant and Move More ideas. The officer in charge of Move More would be in touch separately.

Councillor Smith questioned whether there is any County Council funding available.

The list was proposed by Councillor Jones; seconded by Councillor Salt. All **agreed**.

There was a discussion regarding an additional question for those applying for over £2000. They would be required to highlight why their organisation should be treated as a special case, and asked for a breakdown of predicted costs. This would be added to the application form in 2027-28.

It was **agreed** that, if information had been provided by the date of this meeting, the application would be considered. If not, it would be disqualified. Proposed by Councillor Jones; seconded by Councillor Harper.
