# Mayor's Review of the Town Council's year 2024-25

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What an amazing year!

Firstly, I would like to start by thanking Mayoress Mandy Yates, the Deputy Mayor Adrian Lawton, the Council Staff Team led by Chief Officer Sarah Haydon, fellow Councillors and our Town Crier John Robison – who completed 30 years dedicated service to the Town during my tenure as Mayor. But most of all, I'd like to thank the residents of Biddulph. Without your support, both through the many community groups and organising committees, and your attendance at the numerous events throughout the town, have made my year most memorable.

The year started with 'Tea with the Council', an opportunity to talk to residents about their hopes and aspirations for the year ahead. This was shortly followed by my Civic Service, which commenced with a parade from the Town Hall to the Methodist Church on Station Road, led by the ever-enthusiastic Biddulph Ukulele Group- a mixture of joy, formality and organised chaos that put a distinct marker down for the year that was to follow!



Culturally, it was an important year, top and tailed by the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the D-Day Landings and VE Day, which was made even more poignant than usual as it is noted to be the last major anniversary where veterans from the conflict attended in significant numbers. Candles were lit, proclamations announced and fitting commemorative events undertaken. It was a year when the Volunteer Recognition & Civic Awards was reinaugurated, acknowledging the invaluable contributions of local volunteers to the community. The now annual car show showcased the town, the July Festival went from strength to strength, Remembrance Sunday was tremendously well attended and the Town Hall continued to be a focal point for 'What's On' in Biddulph, with various events such as 'Feast and Flicks' and 'Biddulph's Got Soul' to name but a very few.



It was a monumental year for the physical development for Biddulph, with the new Town Hall frontage commencing work, the miners' lamps returning to St. John's Road roundabout, and the mosaic bench being unveiled on Station Road.



Personally, I represented Biddulph across the depth and breadth of the County and beyond, into Cheshire and Derbyshire, and was delighted to welcome many civic guests to Biddulph to my closing Mayor's Ball; a perfect evening attended by many of Biddulph's community groups.



Finally, I have to thank everyone who has helped to support my Mayoral Charity fund and give a special mention to the cycling team – Tony Birchall, Kenneth Chaddock, Dave Lewis, and Wayne Rogers who joined me on an epic cycling challenge from Biddulph to London.

My penultimate engagement was to take assembly at Kingsfield First School to talk about my Cycle Challenge. It gave me the opportunity to thank the staff and pupils for seeing us off at the start and take questions about our experience on the journey. One question stood out – “How old are you?” (came the little voice from the seated throng) “62” I replied – there was an audible gasp from the children; I have never felt so old or so delighted to prove age is nought but a number in equal measure!

What a year, what an honour to be your Mayor – thank you for your faith, kindness and forbearance!

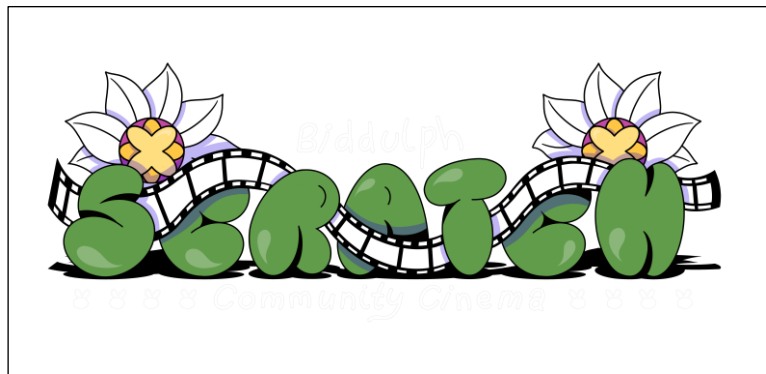
# The work of the Town Council

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There is unlikely to be a year where we won't say, 'that was busy!' and 2024-25 was no different.

2024-25 was a year of **partnerships** and **capital projects**. Biddulph Town Council is able to deliver lovely projects in the town with the help of partners working together, and with the support of funding from outside bodies.

In 2024-25, the Town Council, through a partnership with Film Hub Midlands, started '**Biddulph Scratch**', showing a free film on the first Friday of every month in the Town Hall. This funding has continued into 2025-26, as we celebrate British, Independent and Block-buster films.



As part of our film offering, we continued to host **Feast and Flicks**, which also formed part of the Biddulph Works Together programme of events:



**Biddulph Works Together** is an incredible community partnership, offering warm spaces, free food and support with loneliness and social isolation. 2024-25 was the third year that this group had worked together. A timetable of events is produced each year, and a wide range of community groups come together with the aspiration of making things better; partners provided around 7000 meals during 2024-25.

**Biddulph Works Together 2024-25 A Warm Welcome**

There were **lots of events** throughout 2024-25, including a Prayer Breakfast (June), D-Day 80 celebrations (June) , Classic Vehicle Show (September), Volunteer and Civic Awards Ceremony (September) and the town Christmas Lights Switch-on (November). At each of these, we offered free food and activities to the community.

There were other important events during 2024-25 such as the celebration of **50 Years of Biddulph Town Council** (May). We produced a commemorative booklet, highlighting key activities and decisions during this time, and held an afternoon tea for previous Mayors.



**UK Shared Prosperity Funding** supported a range of events and community projects (both capital and revenue) in 2024-25.

As a result, Biddulph Town Council was able to host a Garden Festival with the Gardener's World presenter Rachel de Thame as the guest speaker, alongside Brian Vowles from Biddulph Old Hall.



Biddulph Town Council also launched our older people's research at Health and Wellbeing Fair in October.

We were delighted to host our first **Chinese New Year**, with support from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund and the Outside Arts project.



There have been a number of improvements to the Town Council's assets during 2024-25. With the support for UK Shared Prosperity Fund and Film Hub Midlands we were able to add **surround sound** and improved equipment to the Hall itself, to improve our cinema offer. We also commenced the regeneration of the town centre in 2024-25 with the **Town Hall frontage** project. This will be completed in 2025-26 and will include a mining memorial, increased planting and space for outside events.



In September 2024, we opened the new **mosaic bench** at the Station Road gardens. The board on-site reads:



# STATION ROAD MOSAIC BENCH



Biddulph Town Council commissioned local artist Philip Hardaker to design and install a piece of artwork at Station Road. Philip is well known for his community work, and for the creation of many important pieces of art around the country. This project was completed in 2024.





There are parts of the town that honour the significance of the mining industry. It was decided that this sculpture would also pay tribute to other key industries that shaped Biddulph's history, such as the forges, textiles and mills (including fustian), which highlight the contributions of women, nursing at the Grange, transport, farming, the blue dye works, and quarrying—specifically whetstone and sand.

We also wanted the bench to remember activities that happen(ed) in the town, such as 'pigeon fancying', bowling, football, tennis, etc. There are images of some of our iconic buildings and heritage features too. These are represented in tiles that form a seat. We hope you enjoy sitting on the bench and reflecting on the tiles that have been created by our community.

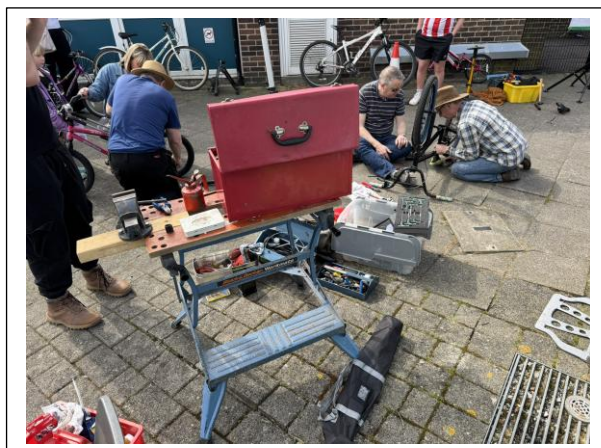
During 2024-25, the Town Council supported the installation of a **new sewage treatment installation** at the Visitor Centre at Biddulph Grange Country Park. We also installed **new windows** at the café, with support from the County Councillors.

We were part of an exciting partnership in 2024-25 called ‘**Chain Reaction**’. This started with the Mayor’s Charity ride to London, and was followed by an event within the town centre and other activities planned throughout the year.

**We aim to:**

- Find new homes for bikes that have been taken to the Recycling Centres.
- Help you to learn how to do repairs and look after your bikes.
- Encourage more residents to get on bikes and find amazing places to ride.
- Start lots of conversations about cycling in our area.





In this year, we created the ‘Caring for our Environment Plan’, setting out our commitments to a wide range of initiatives. We also continued to **plant trees**; adding an additional 450 trees along Biddulph Valley Way in the spring of 2025.



Finally, we were able to secure funding for a **Library of Things** from Staffordshire County Council, which will be a project for implementation in 2025-26.

At the **Burial Grounds**, 95 people were interred in 2024-25. We were also successful with getting planning permission for the development of the new Garden of Remembrance at the Woodhouse Burial Ground.

Our **allotment sites** continue to be full, with around 30 people on the waiting list.

Finally, we are incredibly grateful to the 60 people who attended **First Aid for Mental Health** training in 2024-25. This was funded by the Town Council.
